

OUR HUMMINGBIRD FEEDERS

People spend hours enjoying the antics of hummingbirds at these lovely feeders. These feeders are handcrafted from premium grade solid copper. Every feeder is a unique work of art created for your garden or patio. The feeders are created as it was in “the olden days”, but with a fresh twist. Each tube holder is hand-shaped to the exact fit of the glass nectar feeding tube and then individually assembled onto the hand-shaped stem. Because each piece is individually handcrafted, no two pieces will ever be exactly the same. Each piece will continue to be unique and one-of-a-kind.

The solid copper feeder will grow more beautiful each year. Time and the elements will continue its aging. First, it will change from its natural bright copper color, then into a reddish-brown and eventually develop into a verdigris blue-green patina (just like the statue of liberty!)

All of the glass feeding tubes comes complete with bright red stoppers for easy refilling. The clear glass nectar feeding tubes makes it easy to clean, prevents discoloration and allows you to actually see the hummingbird lick the nectar from the tube as they drink.

The idea behind this exclusive design is to provide hummingbirds with a healthy supply of fresh nectar; this is very important for attracting hummingbirds. It is simply a delightful sight to see a hummingbird empty each tube. You don't have to constantly refill the feeder, the hummingbirds can find enough food for themselves.

When your tubes are all empty, clean them by placing the empty tubes in a microwavable cup filled with warm water. Add one-fourth teaspoon of white vinegar and microwave for one minute.

Adjust the tubes slightly above horizontal, so that there is no leakage. The air bubble should be close to the rubber stopper when the feeder is hanging. Don't be concerned; the hummingbird's tongue can reach the bottom of the tube.

The safest, purest nectar you can prepare is by mixing three parts water with one part white table sugar, boil, and stir until dissolved. Store the extra nectar in your refrigerator. Please do not add food coloring, as it is harmful to hummingbirds.

To help attract hummingbirds to your feeder, add color by hanging a pot of flowers on it or tying a bright ribbon.

Always remember to twist the tubes to the right going in and out of your feeder, don't try to pull directly out. Before refilling your empty tube, you may want to run some warm water over the stopper before twisting the stopper out.

Note: If you discover that bees or wasps suddenly become attracted to your feeder, apply Avon's Skin-So-Soft Bath Oil to the outside of the tubes. Put the bath oil in a misting bottle and spray the tubes. The bath oil will not harm the birds as it is not in their food and the birds have no sense of smell. However, it will keep the bees and wasps away.
